6	Activities and occurrences		
	Modern Slavery Måns gave an update. For any company with 30 June end of financial year the Modern slavery act reporting requirement is 31 March 2021. Government has released 4th batch of Modern Slavery Act statements and considered to be of mixed quality. Last week the Government released a <u>publication</u> looking into the forced labour issue in Xinjiang and the government has made a <u>submission</u> into parliamentary inquiry into proposed modern slavery legislation banning imports from Xinjiang region and potentially elsewhere in China. Considered a big issue in 2021 as US has implemented very harsh restrictions and other countries may follow. Australia heavily relies on China for sourcing		
	and therefore it is a big issue here. Måns and Kate Turner outlined recent activities by IAST – APAC (Investors Against Slavery and Trafficking). As part of work stream 1, IAST - APAC issued an investor statement to the ASX 100 companies in late 2020 outlining what the signatories of the investor statement expect from them and that they want companies to go above and beyond legal compliance. Replies received were varied and some forwarded to their boards. Kate Turner noted IAST has kick started engagement with the second work stream (company engagement) and initial company meetings have been held.
